Context

Our Lady Star of the Sea Howick is state integrated Catholic school catering for students in Years 1 to 6, in Howick, Auckland. Established 176 years ago, the school is connected to the parish and local community offering academic, spiritual, physical, and emotional growth opportunities for the whole child.

Our Lady Star of the Sea School, Howick's vision for learners is 'Confidently living, learning and serving with Jesus as our guide'.

The strategic priorities for improving outcomes for learners are:

- Growing the wellbeing of our community
- Growing our rich curriculum to ensure all learners succeed as children of God
- Growing our Catholic community to serve God's world.

The school can draw from the following strengths to support the school in its goal of evaluating how effectively it partners with whānau, from all cultures, to further strengthen learner outcomes:


- leadership and governance that effectively enacts the school vision, special character and strategic direction
